EDUCATION

September marks the beginning of our 2015-16 Sunday School program. We are offering some great opportunities for children and adults. Thanks to the dedicated teachers and helpers who have committed to invest in the Christian education of our congregation. **All classes will begin at 10:30.**

The Altar Guild...who are we and what to do we, anyway? Well, we are a group who perform many behind the scenes duties. You could call us the “Prop and Set committee” or maybe even “the Roadies”, who work backstage to prepare for the important sacraments of communion and baptisms. We prepare the altar with parameters to reflect the Church Season and adorn it with flowers (quite often from our members’ gardens). Basically, we ensure that everything on the altar is ready for worship (i.e. candles, communion service, offering plates and special offering cups).

- ✦ We prepare and clean up communion service and are involved in arranging for acolytes and preparing them for service.
- ✦ We also prepare for baptisms and contribute items to be included in the Faith Chests that are presented to the family.
- ✦ We handle the Cradle Roll for newly baptized babies under 3 years old to offer communication with the child and parents every six months for three years.
- ✦ We decorate the altar with flowers at Easter from orders we get from members of the congregation. We also plant red geraniums in front of church for the season of Pentecost. We provide corsages for the confirmands on Confirmation Sunday.

Currently, we are group of women; however, we do not discriminate. There is no special talent or gender required. The sole requirement is the desire to serve in a quiet, gentle way. Quite often, it seems the only time a member of the congregation might become aware of what we do is IF it didn’t get done! And that suits us just fine. So....if you have a desire to give and be of service in a capacity that doesn’t require being in front of people or knowing how to play an instrument, give thought to joining us....the more, the merrier and the lighter the work. Dear Family at PLC



Summer is quickly past and we suddenly find ourselves in a new season.

We Montanans love our summers! It is hard for us to give up the long days of sunlight and warm temperatures. We become accustomed to our laidback schedules with free time that is open for us to plan things. The change to a fall schedule seems so abrupt. There really isn't any way to get ready for it.

But somehow we do. Many of us change gears as our schedules fill with school activities and hunting trips. The same happens at the church as you can tell by the calendar in this newsletter.

Summer schedule at the church takes a bit of a break from the regular activities of the school year. Sunday school, confirmation instruction, Peace-Makers and Ladybug pre-school all get going again in September. Soon, the choir will be practicing to add sounds of praise to our Sunday worship services. We will be having a class for new members who want to join the church. New outreach ideas are being discussed as we look for ways to bring the love of Christ to those who are in need.

Whenever things change, like they do with seasonal change, we make adjustments and learn what works best for us and our families. I want to take this opportunity to offer a few suggestions to keep spiritual development on your minds.

This fall during the Adult Forum, our Christian education for adults offered after Sunday worship, we will be turning our focus toward something we all think is important yet often find it hard to do... prayer.

Why is prayer so hard?

Many of us have asked that question. We want to pray. We intend to pray. But, as spiritual director and college professor MaryKate Morse notes, "we don't pray consistently or as meaningfully as we might like."

We'll be using MaryKate's book, [A Guidebook to Prayer](#) to lead us in exploring the spiritual riches offered through the practice of prayer. Each participant will receive a copy of the book and we will work through it together. Each chapter explores a different angle of prayer with sections focusing on each of the persons of the Trinity - Father, Son and Holy Spirit. And each chapter offers specific ways to pray on your own, with a partner and/or in a group.

It is my hope that PLC becomes a praying family in which each member feels equipped and practiced in ways that will make prayer rewarding and rich.

Before this sounds like adding just one more thing to your already packed schedule, think about the time you have to invest in your personal spiritual development. I ask that you take a moment and consider developing your "prayer muscles" this fall. I think we can all benefit from the workout.

And last, but in no way least, is the time we spend in worship every Sunday at 9 AM. Worship affords us a time when God's people can gather together in faith, unity and purpose to sing our praises, receive the Lord's Supper, bring our prayers to God and to learn from God's Holy Word.

July 9, 2015

The meeting was opened by President Larry Oddy at 7:02 p.m. Members present: Larry Oddy, Mike Hansen, Jerry Swensen, Russ Fox, Derrick Monson, Tiina Smith, Tom Gruss, Mike Streich, Bill Miller, Val Ross, Pr. Bob Coughlin, Pr. Jeff Redlin, Dave Lazendorf, guest.

1. Opening Devotions: Bill Miller
2. Minutes: Motion to approve, Mike S., second Russ Fox, approved.
3. Treasurers Report: Note: At the Congregational Meeting of May 17, 2015, the Council was authorized to spend up to \$6000 to fix the security alarm system. Derrick Monson repaired it for \$160.00. The car wash was a great success to raise money for the youth mission trip in the amount of \$565. A motion to approve was made by Tom Gruss, second Tiina Smith, approved.
4. Congregational Concerns:
 - a. There was a mess in the parking lot from 4th of July fireworks set off by unknown persons. Val spent more than an hour cleaning it up. This item is tabled until the June 2016 meeting.
 - b. The "List" in the Fellowship Hall is near completion.
 - c. We have no high school students to run streaming in the summer. Pr. Jeff and Mike Hansen volunteered to help if Carl Swensen will train them.
 - d. Larry asked that a diagram and directions to operate the sprinkler system be posted by the sprinkler system box.
 - e. Black heel marks on the tile in the fellowship hall are very hard to remove.
5. Pastors Reports
 - a. Pr. Bob reported on the successful Lazendorf wedding and commended the volunteers. Sandy and Paul's move went well. They arrived safely. Thanks to all who helped pack. He attended the 60th anniversary celebration at the Soldier's Chapel in Big Sky. He reported meeting a new attendee named Carl Petterson, who liked PLC and the friendly people. Intervarsity is having a going away party in Durango, Colorado, for Pr. Bob on July 31 – August 1, 2015, that he will attend.
 - b. Pr. Jeff reported that on June 16 he joined Pr. Bob and Kari Hass for Family Promise meeting. The Richland Lutheran Church youth group, from Richland, Washington, came here and had a good fellowship time. He will present a two-part series on the faith of our founding fathers. The Northwest District Council meeting will be in Spokane July 20. The Constitution & Bylaws Committee will meet August 12. He will be on vacation July 2-6 at the Centennial of his family farm. There is a ballast out in his office. Tom will fix it. A visitor from the New Day Bakery in Belgrade donated bakery goods and also has them for sale on Sunday mornings. He could possibly deliver. This could be helpful to people who have signed up for Sunday snacks. The subject of the Council minutes being available to the public was brought up. See New Business 6.g.
6. 6. New Business
 - a. Val was directed to pay for the parking lot paving out of Building Fund, leaving \$2500 in that account, and pay monthly payments of \$2000 plus hardhat donations.
 - b. Security Camera. Questions were raised on the system, one of which was "does it record?" Dave Lazendorf reported on the system and its capability. Larry asked for volunteers to research the system and install it. Derrick, Dave, and Tom volunteered.
 - c. Sign for Community Garden. The sign was removed to make way for parking lot expansion. Mike H. volunteered to replace it.

- d. Habitat for Humanity sent a letter asking for assistance in providing lunches for 10 to 15 volunteers in July. Tiina, as a member of the Servant Committee said they could do it one day. Bill Miller also volunteered to help with food as well.
- e. Driveway at Parsonage. There is an issue with the driveway paving, which will be looked at and resolved.
- f. A letter went out to Bill Rosner regarding use of PLC facility for music practice. A copy will be provided to Council members by Pr. Bob.

7. Team Reports

- a. Congregational Life: Two events scheduled. July 23, 6:00 pm, is the Church Picnic at Lewis and Clark Park in Belgrade. PLC will provide meat and drinks and condiments. Members bring potluck items. On August 9 the Sunday morning service will be held in the park at 9:00 am. The park fee of \$50 has been donated. There will be no service at PLC. The Council will provide the refreshments following the service. Mike H. moved to approve, Derrick seconded, approved. Salt and Pepper dinners. Ask that host family structure it with a question of the evening. They would like someone to give a testimony about previous dinners.
- b. Education and Youth: Met June 30. Needs CD's. Kari sanitized toys. The Boy Scouts have volunteered to sanitize toys in future.
- c. Property Care: No meeting, but some issues, namely the parking lot, are done.
