### **CALL COMMITTEE SURVEY RESULTS**

The Call Committee would like to thank everyone who completed their survey. This information will be very helpful in choosing Pr. Jeff's successor. Here are the results as of Wednesday, May 23.

- 1. The majority of the surveys indicated they prefer a minister.
- 2. The majority of the surveys indicated they would prefer 2-5 years of experience.
- 3. The majority of the surveys indicated no preference between male and female.
- 4. Some of the strengths the surveys indicated were: communicator; good listener; compassionate; biblically based teacher; be involved in both the church and the local community; work well with young people and young families; leader.
- 5. Large majority indicated that Biblically based teaching is important.
- 6. Majority liked the mix of services.
- 7. Other: to apply teachings to our current times; good fit with Pr. Bob; some want efficient use of time in the services; to know God and have a biblical knowledge; commit to serve; energetic; mission opportunities; how can they make us better followers of God.

We have all said, or at least have heard the saying, "Time flies." Well that sure is true for me. My first immersion, so to speak, in the life of Peace Lutheran Church, was during the Lent season (February- March of 2014). Prior to that in 2013, Misty and I had worshipped here mainly in stealth mode. Meaning that we kept the fact that I was an ordained LCMC pastor to ourselves! But, when your beloved Pastor Bob was stricken with a sudden and severe heart attack during surgery, I knew the Lord God had brought me here to help you out in a pastoral way.

But as time went on, I realized it was more than just that. I began to understand that this was a *calling*, that Peace Lutheran Church was a very special place with very special people. I grew to know I was welcomed for who I was as a person, and for the particular pastoral gifts and abilities that God has blessed me with. As Pastor Bob was able to return to full-time pastoral ministry as your Lead pastor I discovered that we complimented each other quite well as pastors and that we shared a mutual respect and fondness for each other that continues to this day.

Which brings me to speak about the current time. Most of you know that Misty and I are moving to Minnesota at the end of June. In fact, June 24, will be my last Sunday with you. Our reasons for doing so make sense to us and I pray that you will understand also. First, we desire to be closer to our children and grandchildren living in Minnesota. We are over 1000 miles away from our 3 year old granddaughter and 1 year old grandson. We miss them greatly and want to be part of their growing years and more grandchildren are being planned for by our 2 sons and their wives! Misty and I also have siblings and their families nearby in Minnesota that we look forward to seeing on a regular basis.

Secondly, at age 63+ I want to slow things down and phase into retirement. With that in mind, I have accepted a part-time call at Bethlehem West Elbow Lake Lutheran Church in Elbow Lake, Minnesota. I have learned that the members there use the acronym BWELL. Rather clever, that! I think of it as *be well* in Christ. Anyway, it is a congregation that worships about 50 people a week in the county seat of Grant county. Misty and I are actually making our home in Fergus Falls, 20 miles from Elbow Lake in the hilly, lake country of west central Minnesota. BWELL is a congregation that desires an experienced solo pastor and I am looking forward to a return to that position as I near the finish line of my pastoral career.

Thirdly, it has also become apparent to us that the Gallatin Valley has become too expensive for us to retire in even if we wanted to. I was a farmer for many years and as such I do not have sufficient pension, 401k's, etc. to make a go of it here in retirement. Moreover, this valley is growing and changing rapidly and for me personally, this growth and change does not suit me well.

Sisters and brothers in Christ, I will leave here with a grateful and thankful heart. Misty and I have been richly blessed during our time with you! Your support and encouragement are something that we treasure. We will truly miss you! It is my sincere hope that my 4 years as a pastor at Peace Lutheran Church will be something that all of you are grateful and thankful for as well.

As I sit to write this month's letter to you, I am a few days away from our study tour of Israel with Montana Bible College. We have been planning for this since November by reading books, watching educational videos, meeting with members of the group, gathering travel documents, packing and praying.

To say that we can't believe the day has finally come is a vast understatement!

While in Israel, we will be following the 'footsteps of Jesus'. After our first morning at our "welcome to Jerusalem" on the Mount of Olives we head south to Bethlehem and the surrounding area. We'll make our way to the Jordan River and float on the Dead Sea. We then travel up north to Mount Carmel, Nazareth and the towns surrounding the Sea of Galilee taking in sites where Jesus taught, called his first followers, calmed the storming seas, and preformed several miracles. We will climb the hill and take in the view from the Church of the Beatitudes near Capernaum in the vicinity of where Jesus gave his Sermon on the Mount.

Lastly, our journey takes to Jerusalem to visit the marked sites of the of Jesus' last supper with his disciples, the garden where he went to pray and was betrayed and arrested. We will spend time visiting remains of the temple and places during Jesus trial and crucifixion. We end our tour in places devoted to the resurrection, the ascension and the spot where the Christian Church was born.

Just writing this is getting me excited!!

I decided to go on this journey while I am still a pastor in hopes that it will help make me a better one! I expect this first-hand experience in the 'Land of the Bible' will open my eyes to see things and be able to teach things from fresh perspective. Personally, I am looking for this experience to enrich my spirit and energize my soul.

I am very grateful to have this opportunity of a lifetime! I am grateful that Dianne can go with me. Being with Fred and Kari Haas from our congregation is such a bonus! I am grateful for the time of vacation and study granted by the Church Council. I am also very grateful that Pastor Jeff remains at PLC so that the pastoral duties will be well covered!

We ask for your prayers for our health and safety, for our openness to learn and for our willingness to serve those that we are with. I look forward to telling you all about our experience after we return June 13.

The LWR truck has come and gone once again. It never ceases to amaze us how God works with the people of Southwestern




Montana. The semi started its journey in Missoula collecting donations from the Missoula area churches. Several congregations dropped off their contributions with the final loading point being our parking lot.




