THE RE-OPENING OF PEACE LUTHERAN CHURCH

Phase 1

First and foremost, we want to give honor and praise to our Lord. We are so grateful to be a part of the Peace Community and we can't wait to get together to worship our Risen Savior again.

However, in order to be wise/prudent and to watch out for the vulnerable among us, we have developed guidelines for a safe and thoughtful return to worship. Please see page 2 & 3.

Reopening Peace Lutheran Church Phase 1

<u>Peace Lutheran Church will follow local, state and federal guidelines which are in effect. Additionally, and specific to our re-opening:</u>

- If you are not feeling well, stay home. This is extremely important for all of us.
- We will continue to livestream the 9:00 am service, so watching from home is always an option for anyone who prefers not to venture out.
- To begin with, we will hold two worship services: <u>9:00 am</u> and <u>10:45 am</u>. Families whose last name begins with "A-M" are asked to attend the <u>9:00 am</u> service, and last names of "N-Z" are asked to attend the <u>10:45 am</u> service. (Family/grandparents with different last names are welcome to come together). Due to the size of our sanctuary, we are aiming for no more than 20 households at each service.
- Maintain 6 foot distance between family units as you enter the church. Use hand sanitizer (mounted on wall), then take a bulletin and enter the sanctuary. You are welcome to leave the sanctuary through any of the doors (west door in back of the sanctuary, south door by the piano, or main entrance.) Doors and windows will be kept open (weather permitting) for fresh air exchange.
- Seating in the sanctuary will be done to allow 6 foot distancing between family units. To begin with, council members will serve as ushers in order to ensure proper social distancing. (The fellowship hall will be available with streaming in the event it is needed to maintain proper spacing.)
- We will print enough bulletins with music/liturgy/and Scripture for both services. They will not be reused, but should be taken home or deposited in the recycling box on your way out.
- We ask parishioners not to shake hands, hug, or share "the peace" with each other at this time.
- For communion, pastors will bless the elements, and then each family group will go up separately to pick up their elements, partake, and deposit the cups before returning to their seats.
- An "offertory box" will be placed near the main entrance of the sanctuary where you pick up your bulletin. People can also continue to give online or by mail.
- Before entering the sanctuary, wash your hands and use the hand sanitizer that is provided in "easy to reach" locations in the church. We also strongly encourage the use of face masks, though it is not a requirement. Again, please stay home if you are not feeling well.
- For parishioners needing to use the restroom, please stagger use of bathrooms to minimize congestion in the hallway. In addition, we will have disinfecting wipes/spray for parishioners to clean the faucets, door handles, and toilet handles after use.

- Following each service, we will ask parishioners to use available supplies to wipe down the areas where they were sitting and to vacate the sanctuary in a "methodical" manner. Council and other volunteers will disinfect common spaces (including restrooms, faucet & toilet handles, doorknobs, light switches, etc.) before and after each service.
- There will be no fellowship activities or refreshments following worship at this time.
- Unfortunately, we will not be able to have the choir gather and sing during this phase 1. The choir will be greatly missed, but we will look forward to their return when conditions allow.
- Lastly, there will be "Phase 1 Reopening Guidelines" posters in the main entrances of the building and on bulletin boards. These posters are a good reminder to help us ensure the safety of one another.

Thank you, Peace Lutheran, for your thoughtful consideration. We appreciate your willingness to join us in doing our part to keep ourselves and each other safe during this time of great change.

¹ Those who live in the shelter of the Most High will find rest in the shadow of the Almighty.

² This I declare about the LORD: He alone is my refuge, my place of safety;

he is my God, and I trust him.

Dear Family at Peace,

As everyone has had to alter their way of life the past month and there is much uncertainty about the days ahead, we struggle, trying to make the best of a very difficult situation. Psalm 91 is a prayer that recognizes two seemingly contradictory realities: while our lives include pain, disease and death, our God is good, a place of safety in whom we can trust.

³ For he will rescue you from every trap and protect you from deadly disease.

⁴ He will cover you with his feathers. He will shelter you with his wings.

His faithful promises are your armor and protection.

⁵ Do not be afraid of the terrors of the night, nor the arrow that flies in the day.

⁶ Do not dread the disease that stalks in darkness, nor the disaster that strikes at midday.

But, the question needs to be asked, "If God is able to do what he says – protect, cover, and shelter, what is our responsibility in following safety procedures and practicing protocols to prevent the spread of this deadly disease?"

The Lord promises all these things to those who make their dwelling in Him.(v.1) Jesus identifies His disciples as those who "abide", "live", "dwell" or "rest" in Him through eating His flesh and drinking His blood. (Jn.6:56) They also live in His word. (Jn. 8:31) Above all else we live connected to him as branches abide in the vine (Jn. 15:7-8) This is Jesus' way of telling us what it means to those who live in the shelter of the Most High. This is what we must strive to do in order to claim God's promises.

While we experience inconvenience, suffering and the evil of the recent pandemic, we also know divine protection and deliverance.

¹⁴ The LORD says, "I will rescue those who love me. I will protect those who trust in my name.

¹⁵ When they call on me, I will answer; I will be with them in trouble.

I will rescue and honor them.

¹⁶ I will reward them with a long life and give them my salvation."

We do not know what to expect from a time such as this. But we can live with the expectation that we have life because of the resurrected Jesus who has been sacrificed so that we might be reconciled with our Heavenly Father. The victory has already been won!

During this time of uncertainty and fear, we choose to live in the shelter of the Most High and find rest in the shadow of the Almighty.


FRIDAY, JULY 10.....Lutheran World Relief Truck will be here to load quilts.


