Dear Family at Peace,

Happy New Year! I am sure I am not the only one to welcome the New Year, 2021, with hopes that it will be less tumultuous than the year to which we have just said "goodbye". As we look forward with optimism and hopefulness of getting together as a church-family again and gaining a sense of our "old normal".

Or will we ever? Should we ever?

As many negatives to which we all can point from this past year, we do well to find the positives – the things we can learn from the experiences we have just gone through. We only need to consider all that we have missed this past year because we have been restricted against them. Perhaps we can find new value in those things a not take them for granted. We have learned new ways of doing things that just may be better.

It is far too easy to poke at the things about 2020 that we gladly leave behind us. We all can point to the way's life used to be, activities we long for and cannot wait until they return once things get straightened out. But can we ever count on that? The darkness has grown darker. - Everyone who helped take down and pack away the Christmas decorations.





I was contacted about 2 months ago about a possible quilt project for the Peace Re-Piecers. A Belgrade lady had gotten my name from Stitch of Seventh where I quilt each week. She had 27 quilt tops and the program she generally gives them to wasn't meeting this year to complete the quilts. She wanted them to be completed and given away as an act of kindness.


The Re-piecers were immediately into the project and over the next 3 weeks we added the batting, backs and serged the edges. It reminded me of what an old fashion guilting bee would be like.

Our first plan was to give to the Memory Care facility on Jackrabbit and the rest would go to Family Promise. When Jinx contacted Family Promise they said they didn't have a need at this time. OOPS....what are we going to do with 15 lap quilts (most of them made with Christmas fabric)? Pastor Bob and Pastor Andrew were meeting with other pastors that afternoon so we suggested the pastors take some quilts if they had congregational members in need. One of the pastor's wives is a hospice nurse and when he told her about the quilts she called Pastor Bob to see if she could get several for her patients.

The best purpose was delivering the remaining quilts to members of our own congregation that have not had direct contact with us for many months.

Oh, what a blessing it has been to do this project and see God's hand directing us to give kindness during this very trying time. It was amazing to see our elderly members and wish them a Merry Christmas.
