Dear Peace Lutheran Family,

We hope you had a wonderful Advent and Christmas season. We look forward to sharing in God's Word together in 2023. On Sunday, January 15th, we will begin the season of Epiphany. What does "*Epiphany*," mean?

"Epiphany," means "to be visible" or "revealed". Specifically, in John 1:14, we read, "The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth." In other words, God's greatest gift has been revealed to us in God the Son, who became flesh and lived among us, showing us the Father's true forgiveness and faith in Jesus' atoning death on the cross for our sins and His glorious resurrection from the dead. Through Christ we have eternal fellowship with God and each other, just as Jesus promised, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me (John 14:6)." Okay, why is the season of Epiphany important?

In Matthew chapter 2, we read the fascinating story about the Magi who traveled a great distance to seek and worship the Christ-child. When the miraculous star stopped above the house where the Christ-child was, the Magi were "overjoyed" and revealed/gave gifts that were proper for this King--gold, frankincense and myrrh. The great value of these gifts would have helped cover living expenses while Joseph, Mary, and young Jesus lived in Egypt and returned to Nazareth.

But, the spiritual nature of these gifts revealed to the King of kings is significant, too. Starting with the gold that the Magi gave--it symbolizes God's eternal glory through the Son who is "the Door" to the Father's glorious kingdom that endures forever, just as Jesus promised, "I am the door. Whoever enters through Me will be saved. They will come in and go out, and will find pasture (John 10:9)."

Frankincense and Myrrh were strong aromatic spices that were rare and honorable gifts for kings, but spiritually-speaking, by entering through the King's *Door*, we are the "aroma" of Christ. In other words, our Spirit-filled worship, service, prayers, outreach, gifts, etc., areke "sweet fragrances" to God through Christ who gave His life for us (Ephesians 5:1-2). So, how can we apply the meaning of Christ's Epiphany in our lives today?

Prayer. Why? Because Jesus prayed. He still prays for us. During his earthly ministry He spent hours praying. He modeled a humble, authentic prayer life. Noticing His unwavering desire to pray genuinely, lovingly, and openly to the Father, the disciples asked Jesus, "*Teach us to pray* (Luke 11:1)."

What a profound moment! In the same way, Peace Lutheran, what if we asked Jesus to teach us to pray? Imagine the gifts that He will continue to reveal through us. Okay, how do we start?

There's no "secret formula". Prayer is genuine, heart-felt worship to God. So, let's encourage each other by praying together. (*Below is a simple outline to encourage us to pray.)

- <u>Sunday, January 15th</u> -- We will focus on giving God prayers of praise for His salvation just as Jesus promised, "For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have everlasting life (John 3:16)."
- <u>Sunday, January 22nd</u> -- We will focus on "thanking" Jesus for His "daily bread" in our lives. Having food, shelter, clothing, clean water, security, vocations, hobbies, etc., how can we show God gratitude for these gifts? How can we use God's "daily bread" to point others to Him?

- <u>Sunday, January 29th</u> -- We will focus on forgiving others as Christ has forgiven us. In other words, with God's help, let's "let go" of grudges and let God heal our relationships with Him and each other.
- <u>Sunday, February 5th</u> -- We will focus on praying for the physical and spiritual needs of others worldwide.
- <u>Sunday, February 12th</u> -- We will focus on praying for the physical and spiritual needs of others locally.



We have rung in a new year. This is a time to reflect on the last year and make goals for the new year to come. I would encourage you to look at all the blessing that God has given to you in the last year, thank him for all that he has done and also dream big. God has given us all gifts and wants us to use those gifts to bless others in many ways. So use your talents

and gifts to make goals and dream big for God's glory. *Psalm 65:11 You crown the year with Your goodness and Your path drips with abundance.*


