




2024 Lent season begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14. This service includes Holy Communion and the imposition of ashes.

Soup and bread starting February 21 at 6:15 p.m. followed by Lenten vespers worship services at 7:00 p.m. until Holy Week. This year's theme will be: "WHY WE PRAY"

Come join us on our Lenten journey to the cross.

"Letting go and letting God"...how would you finish that statement?





It's difficult to let go and to let God have whatever you are dealing with. Here's the amazing part, God cares more about it than you do. Is that hard to believe? Why?

The season of Lent is all about letting go and letting God have whatever you've got going on. "But you don't understand. I've been holding this _______ tightly to my chest for a while now."

Why? God understands you better than you understand yourself. He understands why you're holding it tightly to your chest, too. But, He wants it...all of it. He wants you as you are. You're not wasting His/your time by giving _____ to Him either. Why?

Because Jesus does. Jesus "let's go and let's God" save the world through him. Isn't that true? In Jesus's baptism, he exchanged his eternal glory and praise and honor for our futility, darkness, and death. As Pr Bent noted in a recent sermon, in Christ's baptism, we are "tethered to Him" through what he accomplished for us on the cross and in the empty tomb. In other words, by letting go and letting God use Jesus's active righteousness that He accomplished on the cross for our sins, burying them with Him in the grave, and on the third day, being raised again to new, eternal life--we have everything we need--now and forever. Okay, what is Jesus asking you to give to Him?

During this Lenten season, we are going to look at people in Scripture who were called to give whatever they were going through to God. Specifically, for our Lenten soup suppers/evening worship services this spring, we are going to learn about what Hannah, Moses, David, Mary, and Jesus learned by letting go and letting God have whatever they were going through. What did their letting go and letting God have whatever it was He asked them to give to Him impact their devotional lives with God/others?


