<u>Mission Moment - Gallatin Valley Chaplain</u>

Peace Lutheran makes a financial gift each year to the Gallatin Valley Chaplain. Chaplains are part of the Sheriff's Office, which provides oversight, equipment, and office space. Chaplain wages are paid by community donations through individuals and churches. Randy Jones, who you may see visiting periodically at Peace along with his wife Sherry, has been a chaplain with the Gallatin County Sheriff's Office since 2016. Chaplains work and ride with the patrol deputies, jail staff, dispatchers, and other law enforcement agencies in our county and in other counties as needed in times of crisis. They wear the brown Sheriff's Office uniform with a cross on the collar and a badge to identify themselves as a chaplain. Chaplains are on call 24/7 to:

- Counsel law enforcement officers and their families, and other agency personnel
- · Visit sick or injured officers and agency personnel in homes and hospitals.
- · Make death notifications.
- Provide assistance to victims.
- Assist at suicide incidents.
- · Deal with transients and the homeless.
- Provide for the spiritual needs of inmates.
